Routines

Morning drop off

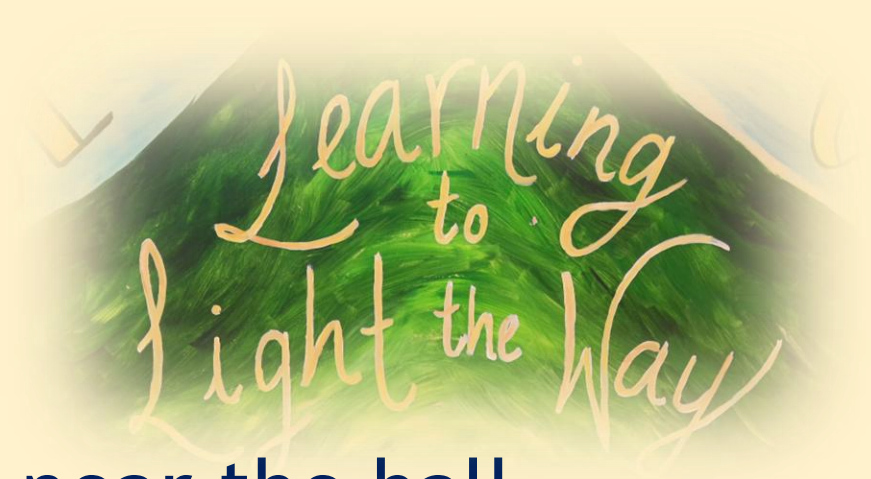
- Between 8.30am and 8.40am
- The Register is taken by 8:45am.
- Drop-off is at the Year 5 door.



Routines

Pick up at end of day

- 3:20pm
- Year 5 will be brought to the playground near the hall.
- A member of the team will hand over your child to you or the person allocated to pick them up.
- In Year 5, children can walk home on their own if written permission has been given.
- The gates will be locked at 3:30pm



PE

This term Saturn class will PE on a **Wednesday** and **Thursday**.

For weeks 2-7 of Term 1, Saturn class will be swimming on a Thursday morning.

- Children to wear their PE kit to school instead of their uniform.
- Parents are advised that earrings should not be worn for PE. Tape is not advisable as it doesn't prevent earrings being ripped out - the official guidance recommends that earrings are removed. Children must be able to remove earrings themselves. However, if earrings are newly pierced, parents are required to cover them with tape.
- Hair longer than chin length must be tied back every day, not just for PE.
- For swimming, children will need to bring their swimming kit, a swimming hat and goggles in a suitable bag.



Equipment in class

Your child will be provided with all the equipment that they need in class.

- Writing pencil
- Purple pen (biro)
- Red pen (biro)
- Glue Stick
- Ruler
- Scissors
- Whiteboard, pen and rubber
- Handwriting pen once they have a pen licence

Every item is kept in their own personal tray. We encourage the children to keep this tidy at all times.



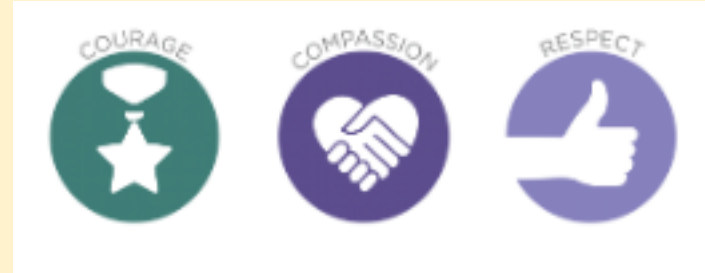
Expectations

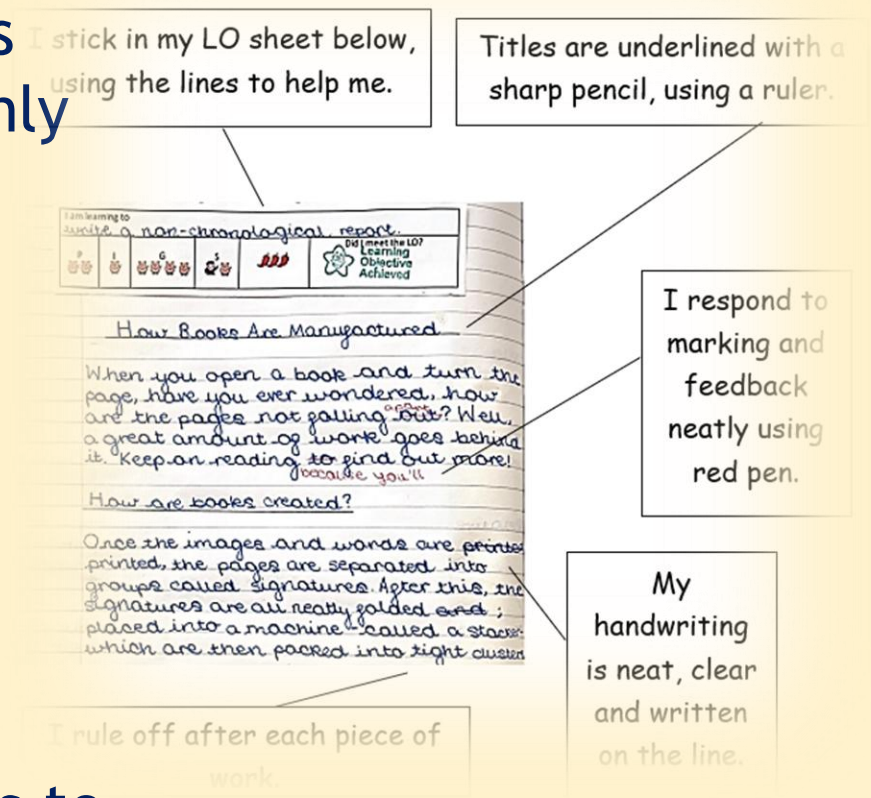

Expectations

- Uniform: all items must be named. Please check labels regularly as names often fade with washing. We can only return lost items if they have names in them.
- Shoes must be smart and black.
- Hair accessories should be small and navy/black.
- We expect children to show a readiness and willingness to learn.
- Children should follow our Maths and English book expectation guidelines so that all work is clear, neat and well organised.

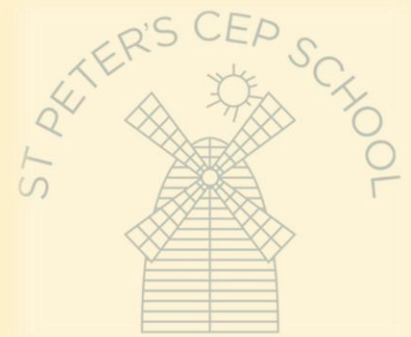


Homework

Reading - please encourage your child to read daily and ideally to an adult. Aim for 3 times a week minimum. Listen and then discuss the story - does your child understand the plot and all the vocabulary? Date and sign in your child's Reading Record that comes to school each day.

- **Monday:** Spellings will be set for a spelling test **every Monday**.
- **Tuesday:** Maths task set on MyMaths.
- **Wednesday:** English - Grammar and punctuation sheet. These will be marked on a **Monday morning** as a class.
- **Thursday:** Times tables - ideally around 20 minutes a week using Times Table Rockstars.
- **Friday:** Weekend challenge based on topic or Science learning.

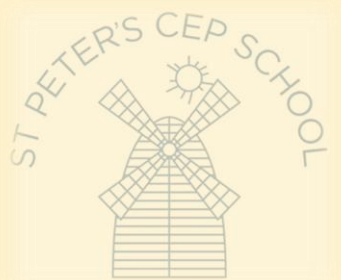
Reading for Pleasure

Your child will have a weekly visit to the school library. This is for your child to choose a book of their choice.

You will also have another Reading Café where you can spend time with your child reading in the library.

Trips and Events

- We are very excited about the trips we have planned for your children this year and look forward to enhancing the curriculum with hands-on learning.
- We have already organised an exciting Viking workshop to embed our learning of the Vikings. This will happen in November.
- We will keep you informed when other trips are planned and will always try to give as much notice as possible.



Assessments and Tests

Ongoing assessments will be completed throughout the year.

You will be given printed information at the end of Terms 2 and 4 about your child's attainment and progress at the Parent Consultation evenings. At the end of Term 6 you will be given a written report including your child's attainment and progress.

Summative assessment

Assessments are undertaken to identify what progress has been made as well as gaps, targets and next steps. They also give the children the chance to practise test techniques.

Formative assessment

Sometimes assessments are formal tests but at other times they are informal such as quizzes, looking at the children's work or listening to their contributions in class.



Other information

- Your child can bring a healthy snack of fruit or vegetables.
- **Water bottles - please name** these. (It is vital that your child has a water bottle in school.)
- We will go outside in all weathers so please ensure your child has a **waterproof coat** (with a hood) and a sun hat in hot weather. The weather often changes during the day so please ensure they come prepared.
- It would be very helpful if your child had a bag each day for school.
- **Milk** can be ordered through Cool Milk. Please see Mrs Page.



Communication with school

Each term you will receive a **Parent Information Letter** which will give you important information about:

- What your child will be learning in the coming term
- Homework requirements
- Other important information about the class

The **School Newsletter** can be accessed via the school website. This usually comes out **once every three weeks**. We aim for **twice a short term**.

The **school website** - class pages.

Arbor - look out for school communications about trips or other class/club messages here.



What should I do if I am concerned about my child?

- The first person to talk to is the class teacher. It is always better to talk about your concerns with teachers rather than by e-mail. A chat with your class teacher is helpful at the end, rather than the start, of the school day as teachers are welcoming the children in to school in the morning.
- If your concern is about a child with special educational or medical needs you can contact Mrs Jenner, our SENCO.
- If you need further advice you can contact the Deputy Headteacher or Headteacher.
